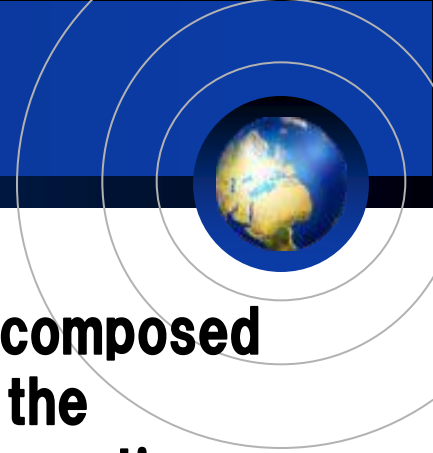

Brief description of Project its purpose and the principal activities

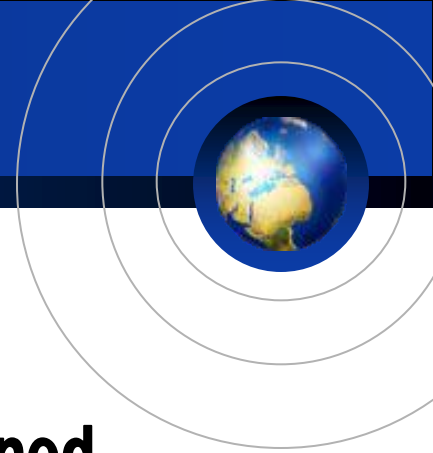


- The APEC e-Government Research Center at Waseda University (Tokyo, Japan) was established in 2005 to provide assistance in looking for solutions to the various challenges of e-Government.
- It also offers recommendations for the improvement of e-Government implementation. As part of the Center's commitment to address e-Government issues, the Center is working on [e-APEC] which APEC SOM commissioned to PECC (Pacific Economic Cooperation Committee) to provide an assessment of progress in implementing the e-APEC strategy.
- The PECC team, headed by Mr. Parsons (Australia) and Prof. Obi, Director APEC e-Government Research Center, presented the report to APEC Ministers in 2005.
- After nine years since the first evaluation stage of "e-APEC," the Center is again to be challenged with the task of monitoring its progress while providing recommendations for future improvement.
- The Center will also organize both the workshop/training and research on online services/applications/public safety/regulation as a continuation of the past activities.
- The Center will continue to be in contact with the Economic Committee and HRD Committee to ask for cooperation as inter Fora activity as well as meetings/research/workshops with international organizations such as OECD and ITU recommended by APEC TELMIN in Okinawa in 2010.

Advisory Committee and Executive Board



- **The Center has organized the advisory committee composed of 12 experts from member Economies to discuss the important issues at the annual advisory committee meeting.**
- **In addition, for this extension of the project, four leading institutions on e-Government in APEC region will cooperate with each other as the network of the Center.**
- **These institutions are Japan's Waseda University Institute of e-Government, Singapore's Infocomm Development Authority of Singapore (IDA), Thailand's E-government Agency (EGA) of MICT and Chinese Taipei's Taiwan E-Governance Research Center (TEG).**
- **The heads of these four institutions will work together as co-project overseers to implement the joint program.**



Activities

- 1. Monitoring and assessing on “ e-APEC”**
- 2. Maintaining data bank for e-Government readiness for member Economies**
- 3. Conducting short CIO training with a distance online system if applicable**
